

## What does the ESY process entail?

- ◆ Eligibility decisions for ESY are determined at student Planning and Placement Team (PPT) meetings.
- ◆ The PPT team will discuss and determine which IEP goals will be focused on during ESY.
- ◆ The PPT will also identify any related services required and offer them during ESY.



### Daily Programming:

- ◆ ESY Teachers will determine daily schedules and program specifics.
- ◆ Students' Individual Educational Plans (IEP) contain summer goals and objectives for each student.
- ◆ The Department of Special Services will mail information to the parents/guardians prior to the program start date including schedules, transportation pick-up and drop off.

### Daily Schedules:

- ◆ Programs run Monday thru Thursday (no Fridays or on Jul 4th)
- ◆ Students will arrive at their schools according to their program start time.
- ◆ Dismissal time depends on program.

## What Exactly is Extended School Year (ESY)?

Under the federal Individuals with Disabilities Educational Act (IDEA), districts must provide ESY for students requiring summer services in order to receive a Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE). There are two broad categories used for considering ESY eligibility:

- ◆ Students who significantly regress with extended school breaks
- ◆ The severity of the student's disability warranting ESY programming

## Program Descriptions

Below are *brief* descriptions of the ESY programs offered by the district. Contact your child's case manager for more details.

- ◆ **Preschool Program at Irving Robbins Middle School - 7/2-26 from 9AM-12PM:** The preschool ESY program is a continuation of lessons, activities, and learning tasks utilized throughout the school year to support IEPs.
- ◆ **Social Skills Collaborative at Irving Robbins Middle School - 7/2-26 from 8:30AM-11:30AM:** This program is intended for elementary students requiring support with social skill development and academic support.
- ◆ **Elementary School Academic Support at Irving Robbins Middle School - 7/2-26 from 8:30AM-11:30AM:** Students are provided with support in math, reading, and writing as indicated by their IEP goals.

## cont'd Program Descriptions

- ◆ **Middle/High School Academic Support at Farmington High School - 7/2-26 from 9AM-12PM:** Students are provided with academic support in content areas as indicated by their IEP goals.
- ◆ **Specialized Learning Center (SLC) at Irving Robbins Middle School - 7/2-8/9 from 8:30AM-1:30PM :** This program is for students on the autism spectrum. The primary focus is on functional/life skills, academics, and social skills. BCBA support is continued during ESY.
- ◆ **Specialized Transition Ed. Program (STEP) at Farmington High School - 7/2-26 from 9AM-12PM:** The program focuses on credit recovery for students with social and/or emotional difficulties.
- ◆ **Summer Place at Farmington High School - 7/2-26 from 9AM-1PM :** This program is for high school students with cognitive and/or social disabilities in need of support with social communication and activities of daily living.
